
Dear Donors, Alumni, Colleagues, and Friends,

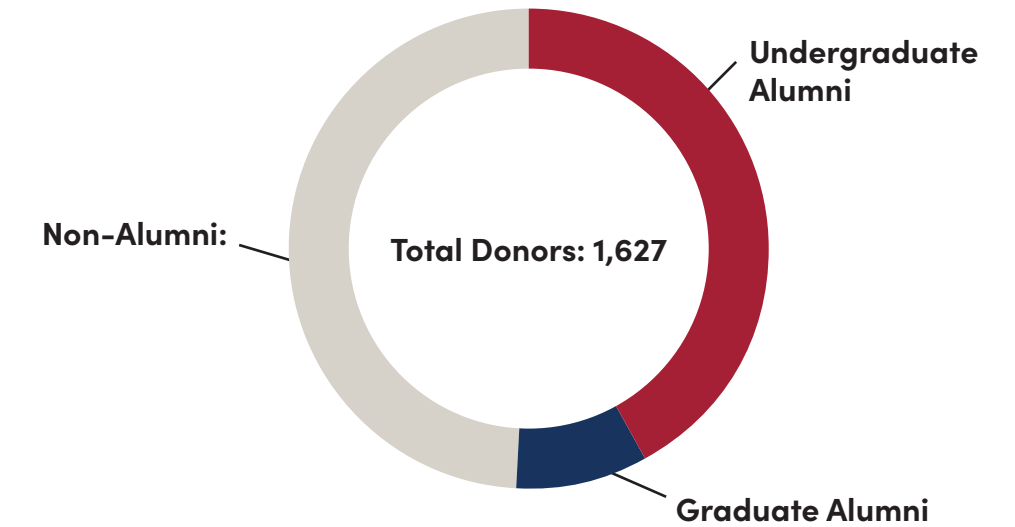
## THE STRENGTH OF OUR CARING COMMUNITY

### SPECIAL GIFTS

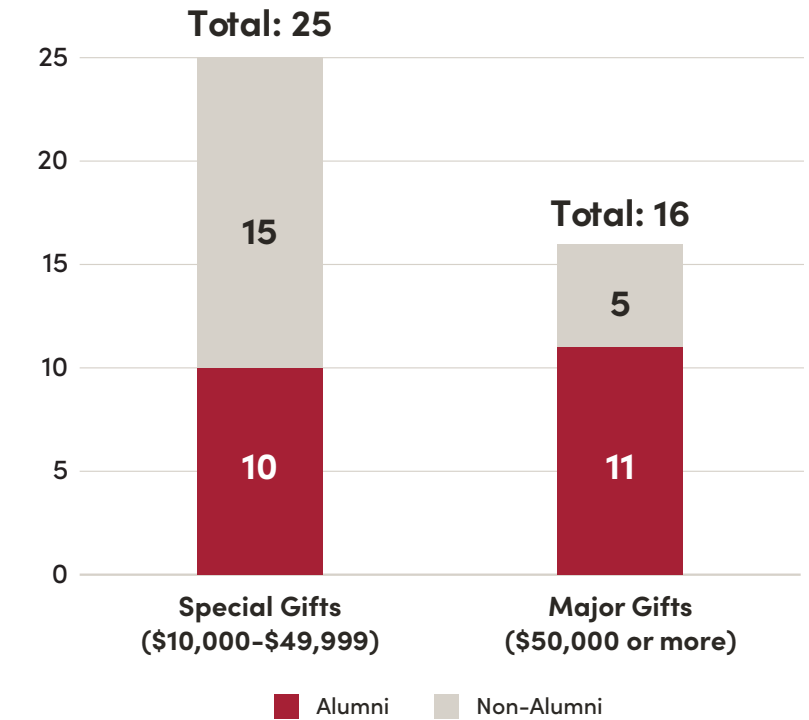
Special gifts (\$10,000-\$49,999) provide immediate support to address the University’s most pressing needs and are imperative to the University’s fiscal strength and well-being.

**25 SPECIAL GIFTS** contributed **\$382,268** to our total achievement.

### MAJOR GIFTS

Major gifts (\$50,000 and greater) provide targeted support for unrestricted or restricted purposes such as endowed scholarships, capital improvements, faculty research, special programming, or the student experience.

**16 MAJOR GIFTS** contributed **\$1,531,189**, representing **58%** of our overall achievement.

## CELEBRATING THE COMPLETION OF THE ARCADIA FINANCIAL AID INITIATIVE

The University established the Arcadia Financial Aid Initiative (AFAI) to grow its endowed scholarship portfolio. Through AFAI, the University provided a 1:1 match for donors who met established gift minimums to either establish a new endowed scholarship or supplement an existing endowed scholarship.

Completed on January 31, 2022, donors to the Arcadia Financial Aid Initiative (AFAI) made extraordinary financial commitments to support the best academic talent, increase Arcadia’s recruitment strength, and provide equitable access to higher education to all who seek it.
