Major Gifts

Major gifts are either unrestricted or restricted gifts of \$50,000 or greater that foundationally advance Arcadia's mission and help the University to remain a first-rate institution.

Our major gifts included estate gifts, blended gifts, multi-year commitments as well as support from donor advised funds. Donors were alumni, current and former Trustees, parents, vendors, and friends.

Special gifts are either restricted or unrestricted new commitments of \$10,000 - \$49,999 that have a substantial impact on Arcadia.

Arcadia received 22 special gifts of \$25,000+ and 29 special gifts of \$10,000 - \$24,999 for a total value of \$332,100.



Virginia H. Lawless (née Hamilton), also known as "Ginnie," graduated from Beaver College in 1939 with a degree in mathematics. A little over a decade after graduating, Ginnie began to make contributions to Beaver College with a first gift of \$1. She continued to give each year for 53 consecutive years.

Ginnie passed away on March 28, 2014, but her support of Arcadia continues. Through planned giving, Ginnie's estate continues to make annual contributions to the University of \$40,000 to \$45,000 each year. A proud mathematics graduate, her estate supports STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) at Arcadia through the Cyril Edward Lawless & Virginia H. Lawless Annual Math & Science Scholarship Fund, co-named for her deceased husband of 55 years.

In the spring of 2024, Arcadia will celebrate its graduates during Alumni Reunion Weekend, with a special emphasis on milestone graduation years ending in 4s and 9s. Ginnie would have been celebrating her 85th Reunion. Her pride in Arcadia lives on through her estate, and as someone who knew her said, "She was proud of Arcadia then and she'd be proud of Arcadia today."
